DID YOU KNOW?

The first European settler on Saint Lucia was a French pirate called Francois Le Clerc. Nicknamed Jambe de Bois – Wooden Leg – he attacked passing Spanish ships during the 1550s from his base on Pigeon Island.

Daren Sammy was the first Saint Lucian to represent the West Indies at cricket. He was appointed team captain in 2010.

The island has two Nobel Laureates more per capita than any other nation. The economist Sir Arthur William Lewis and the poet and playwright Sir Derek Walcott.

Under ancient French law, all beaches on Saint Lucia form part of the Queen's Chain, which means that they are public.

Saint Lucia gained independence from the UK in 1979. The head of state is still the British Monarch, represented on the island by a Governor General.

The Saint Lucia Parrot – the country's national bird, found in the wild only on the island – was threatened with extinction, with the population reduced to around 150 in the 1970s. Thanks to conservation efforts, its numbers have increased significantly since then.



OUR ISLAND

Saint Lucia's landscape is as diverse as her heritage. No two parts of the island are alike! Some parts of Saint Lucia are ideal for bustling nightlife and beachside parties, while others offer opportunities to get away from it all and explore dense jungles and quiet vistas. Get to know our Saint Lucia island before you decide where to stay.

NORTH SAINT LUCIA

North Saint Lucia is one of the most popular locations for visitors to stay. It has seemingly everything just a few minutes away. While this area is harder to get to from the airport, many visitors are likely to stay in this region during their visit.

Nature lovers will appreciate Pigeon Island National Park, which you can reach by car over a causeway. This park offers hiking opportunities, as well as places for kayaking, snorkeling, and swimming. Take some time to walk around the old fort ruins and imagine what it would be like back in the 1700s.

North Saint Lucia is also home to the town of Rodney Bay, which has some of the top Saint Lucia beaches as well as popular nightlife spots. Plantation beach faces the Atlantic side, so you can take advantage of wind sports and surfing. Or you can visit Treasure Bay Casino Saint Lucia and try your luck with cards or roulette. North Saint Lucia has more diverse activities, and is ideal for groups of people traveling together or for families.



SOUTH SAINT LUCIA

The south side of Saint Lucia is closest to the airport, which means you can relax on beautiful beaches and check in to luxury resorts just minutes after your plane lands. The south part of Saint Lucia island is also one of the most historic. Explore ruins and hike around Vieux Fort, which still has rusty canons and old bricks scattered around.

The south side of Saint Lucia also has some quality beaches. Sandy Beach and Anse Des Sables Beach both offer clear water and white sand to relax on. These beaches are known for their length, so you can find a place far away from other visitors if you need to get away for awhile.

Visitors may enjoy taking day trips to other parts of the island if they stay on the south side, so they can explore other parts of the island instead of just the bottom tip.



WEST SAINT LUCIA

The west coast of Saint Lucia is home to Soufrière, the original French capital. While this town is quiet in the off-season, it is a popular tourist destination and a port for many cruise ships. During your visit to Soufrière, walk around the Old Town and pick up a few handcrafted souvenirs for your friends and family back home. You can also use Soufrière as a jumping off point for other excursions around the island.

Soufrière is tucked just under the Petit Piton (the smaller Piton). Its name actually comes from the smell of sulfur emissions from the now-dormant volcanic plug. You can leave the town and go hiking around the Piton and swim in some of the more impressive waterfalls.

The west side of Saint Lucia is also home to Anse Chastanet Beach, which is one of the top snorkeling beaches in the area. If you aren't staying on the west side, consider making Soufrière, the Petit Piton, and Anse Chastanet Beach into a day trip for natural and cultural exploration.



CENTRAL SAINT LUCIA

The final part of Saint Lucia that visitors can explore is the central area. While this part might not have the Saint Lucia beaches that the other parts are known for, it offers a variety of unique opportunities that the other parts don't.

The central part of the island is home to various forest reserves that protect the natural plant and animal life of Saint Lucia. Edmund Forest Reserve is one of the most popular out of all of these. Hike past streaming waterfalls and past rushing streams to reach some of the best views on the island. There are lookouts around the reserve where you can see the small towns and pristine beaches below. Along the way, you might spot some of the island's more exotic birds and even a few small mammals.

While it is harder to find hotel lodging in the central area of Saint Lucia, you can stay in on one of the nearby beaches and visit the center throughout your visit.

Regardless of where you stay on Saint Lucia, whether you choose the bustling Rodney Bay or quieter Soufrière, you're sure to find something you love. Great food, amazing snorkeling, and pristine beaches are right around the corner and beckoning you to stay longer.

ICONIC LANDMARKS & HISTORY

Saint. Lucia is no ordinary island. Her mountains, jungles, beaches, and historic sites whisper echoes of her history to all who visit. Every cliff or buttress tells a story about the island, adding to the personality and nature of St. Lucia and those who live here.

It's impossible to see everything on the island during your visit, and many people live here for years without uncovering all of her mysteries, but there are a few St. Lucia landmarks that you shouldn't miss when you are here.

THE PITONS

Start your exploration of Saint Lucia's famous landmarks with the Pitons, two volcanic plugs on the southwestern coast of the island. Each Piton has its own name: Gros Piton (at 2,530 ft high) and Petit Piton (at 2,438 ft high). These landmarks actually inspired the creation of a local beer, Piton, a light, refreshing drink popular with locals and residents alike.

There are multiple ways for visitors to explore these landmarks. You can hike around them and see exotic plants and animals that call the area home, or you can sail around them to see the Pitons from the water. Many guests to Saint Lucia prefer to do both, as they are captivated by the beauty and shape of the dormant volcanoes along the coast.



PIGEON ISLAND

If you want to combine history and nature in your visit, then Pigeon Island is one of the top Saint Lucia landmarks for you. Pigeon Island was a separate isle until 1972, when the government built a causeway between it and the main island for easy access. Pigeon Island is where the infamous pirate, Jamb de Bois, created a camp to ambush Spanish trade ships.

Visitors can also climb around the ruins of Fort Rodney, which was built by the English to fight the French. Hike around the ruins and pass cannons while you watch nature slowly reclaim the island. You can really feel what it was like guarding the island in the 1700s.

Pigeon Island is a National Park of Saint Lucia, and you can find visitors snorkeling, sailing, and diving just off the shores.



SOUFRIÈRE

Of all Saint Lucia's most famous landmarks, Soufrière is one of the most recognizable. The town's name comes from the sulfurous aromas created by the volcanoes. Explore the town square and get to know the culture of Saint Lucia (while shopping for a few souvenirs along the way), or head out to some of the natural wonders of the islands. The Saint Lucia Diamond Falls Botanical Gardens are also located in this town, and some visitors use Soufrière as a base to hike out to Toraille to cool off in the natural rainforest.

The best way to find iconic landmarks of Saint Lucia is to ask the people who live here. Everyone on the island has a favorite diving spot, hiking trail, or historic ruin that paints a picture of the island's culture. These landmarks are a great place to start, but there's so much more that the island has to offer.



DRIVE-IN VOLCANO

World's only Drive-In Volcano. Now a major tourist attraction in St. Lucia, the road runs right up to and through the crater of the volcano, which emits steam and sulphur with boiling mud and water bubbling away just a few meters from the tourists. You can literally drive right into the crater of this volcano.

At the Sulphur Springs, there is a stream running through the crater, and a little further down are well-established hot springs and mud baths hotter than the average bath. These bathing pools are blessed with volcanic minerals and health-giving properties, which are reputed to have therapeutic qualities for the skin, the reason why the volcano attracts many tourists. You may not like the smell coming from the spring, or stand the heat for long, but your skin will thank you after a quick dip.

The sulphur springs emit a mixture of iron, calcium oxide, sulphur, copper oxide, carbon and magnesium to create the pungent smell and stain the rocks a green colour.

Be prepared for the smell of rotten eggs!

DIVING

MORE THAN 22 WORLD-CLASS
DIVE SITES IN SAINT LUCIA

The twin volcanic spires of the Pitons, surrounded by miles of unspoiled rainforest, make St. Lucia a nature-lover's paradise. However, it's the underwater seascapes that draw scuba divers here. Similar to the above water landscape, you can dive pinnacles covered by coral, sponges and gorgonians in an array of different colors. You'll also find coral reefs, sheer walls and shipwrecks that are full of marine life. Drift through Soufriere Marine Park and marvel at the beauty and diversity of the protected area. The natural charm of Saint Lucia provides the perfect backdrop for adventure and exploration. Some of the dive spots include:

FRIDAY NIGHT STREET PARTY

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BIRD WATCHING

Great tour for bird lovers. The tour sets off just after sunrise to ensure the best sightings. The bird tour is designed to engage everyone from the serious birder to the casual enthusiast. Saint Lucia has six endemic species, one of which is the island's national bird, the Saint Lucia Parrot (*Amazona Veriscolor*), a species that recovered from dangerously low population numbers in the early 1980s.

The other endemics are the Saint Lucia Pewee, Saint Lucia Warbler, Saint Lucia Oriole, Saint Lucia Black Finch and Semper's Warbler. This gives Saint Lucia the distinction of having the highest number of endemic birds in the Eastern Caribbean region.



AERIAL TRAM

The rainforest aerial tram transports guests up and away from the heat and bustle of the lowlands to an ecological park located in the heights of St. Lucia's forest reserve.



ZIP LINING

Get hitched up to a series of cables and zip from platform to platform in the tree canopy and swing like Tarzan.

Trained guides take you on the ride of your life on a course designed for maximum thrill and exposure to the best views of the rainforest.



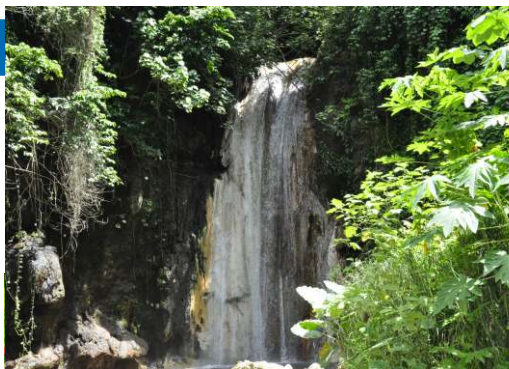
WATERFALL CHASING

DIAMOND FALLS & BOTANICAL GARDENS

The Diamond Falls Botanical Gardens is both a historic and a naturally beautiful site. A haven for birds and insects, which gives one a true nature experience not to be duplicated anywhere within the Caribbean.

The estate is one of the oldest and best-preserved estates on St. Lucia and was originally part of the 2000 acres of land granted to the Devaux family by King Louis XIV of France in 1713, in recognition of their service to 'Crown and Country'.

This historical estate has been transformed from a working plantation that once produced limes, copra and cocoa, into one of the major heritage sites in the region, as well as a viable and spectacular tourist attraction that includes the Botanical Gardens, Waterfall, Mineral Baths, Nature Trail, Old Mill Restaurant and the historic Soufriere Estate House. much more that the island has to offer.



PITON HOT WATERFALL

One of the most refreshing baths. Takes about 10 minutes to walk through a land of indigenous plants to get to these wonderful pools. This water is connected to the volcano but isn't black or muddy. Which means it contains all the minerals from the volcano but again it is not as hot as the mud bath. After leaving this water which you may not want to leave I'll bet you feel 10 times younger.

TORAILLE WATERFALL

A breathtaking waterfall gushes 50 feet over a cliff side and cascades into a pool at the centre of a charmingly landscaped garden. A nature trail with quaint bridges and walk-ways leads you through the lush greens and dazzling colours of this tropical paradise. Take a refreshing bath under the waterfall, and on days when the force of the water is not too strong, you can enjoy an invigorating back and shoulder massage under the falls.



PITON CLIMBING

Gros Piton and Petit Piton are two mountainous volcanic plugs in a world heritage site located in St. Lucia linked by the Piton Mitan ridge. The Pitons are a famous tourist attraction for hikers and mountain climbers in St. Lucia. The Gros Piton rises to a height of 786 m (2619 ft). It is the second highest peak on Saint Lucia. In spite of being the higher of the two Pitons, it is easier to climb than Petit Piton. Petit Piton lies towards the middle of the Soufriere bay, south of the town and north of the larger mountain, Gros Piton. Petit Piton rises to a height of 739 m (2461 ft). The Petit Piton has a steeper side compared to the Gros Piton, and is more challenging to climb and hike. The summit is a much smaller area, but compared to the Gros Piton, it has even better views of St. Lucia and the Piton Bay.



BAMBOO RAFTING

A new and exciting excursion launches this winter in St. Lucia as it becomes the first island in the Eastern Caribbean chain of islands to offer bamboo rafting. Only twenty minutes away from the Castries cruise ship harbour, the Roseau River is the ultimate location of this new thriller.

CHOCOLATE FACTORIES

Cocoa Sainte Lucie is a small Bean To Bar Chocolate production which uses cocoa grown from St. Lucian Soil to produce artisanal Cocoa products.

The term "Bean to Bar" refers to the simple technique of producing Chocolate with little to no processing that is from the harvesting of the actual cocoa bean to the finalized chocolate bar.

This production process is semi-automated.



HOUSE BACK RIDING

A new and exciting excursion launches this winter in St. Lucia as it becomes the first island in the Eastern Caribbean chain of islands to offer house back riding. Only twenty minutes away from the Castries cruise ship harbour, the Roseau River is the ultimate location of this new thriller.

RODNEY BAY MARINA

IGY Rodney Bay Marina, It's upwind at 14 degrees 4 minutes and 43 seconds north latitude and 60 degrees 57 minutes 18 seconds west longitude. These are enviable world-famous coordinates for those who know the meaning of north or southbound wind advantage and are used to getting what they want on the waters. This sheltered bay is home of Saint Lucia's state-of-the-art IGY Rodney Bay Marina.

Located near the northern tip of Saint Lucia, this 253-slip marina contains a full-service 4.5-acre boatyard and a dry dock capacity for 120 boats. It puts the modern-day mariner in excellent hands. The marina is an official port of entry with worry-free processing and impeccable service throughout your stay.

It's situated near spectacular beaches, local action, shopping, island parties, world-class cuisine, and a cornucopia of activities and supplies for your voyage. There are first-class restroom facilities and recreation areas. All this and more makes IGY Rodney Bay Marina the favored destination for the Atlantic Rally for Cruisers (ARC) and for those who love arriving in Saint Lucia as much as they love sailing.



MARIGOT BAY MARINA

Saint Lucia's most discrete locale is as elegant as it is popular among the rich and famous. Hugged by rainforest-clad hills, Capella Marina at Marigot Bay lies 20 minutes north of Soufrière on the west coast in one of the Caribbean's most sheltered bays. And it's one of Saint Lucia's most superb deep-water docks.

Frequented by superyachts and other luxury vessels of the high seas, this 40-berths marina is an official port of entry, where immigration and customs are a breezy affair. Impeccable service, a well-stocked chandlery, luxury provisioning, and duty-free fuel are trademark offerings. Step off the boat and into the quaint intimate locale of Capella Marigot Bay, packed with bars, restaurants, and boutique hotels serving to-die-for cuisine and exquisite spa offerings.

Marigot Bay is a hurricane hole, sheltered in the worst of weather by the steep hillsides that surround its small, deep harbor. Home to several resorts and many excellent restaurants right in the bay, with water taxis making it easy to move around. You can even kayak through the mangroves around this wonderful bay, which featured in the 1967 movie *Dr. Doolittle*, starring Rex Harrison and a large pink snail!
